Jerry Garcia-Purple skin with white & purple flesh, this tie dye potato is a fan favorite.

Yellow Potatoes-A small potato, high yielding but very uniform in size; thrives in lower fertility conditions.

Jelly Bean- Fingling-type with red skin & yellow flesh, easy to grow.

Russet Potatoes-Great skin & very uniform shape.
